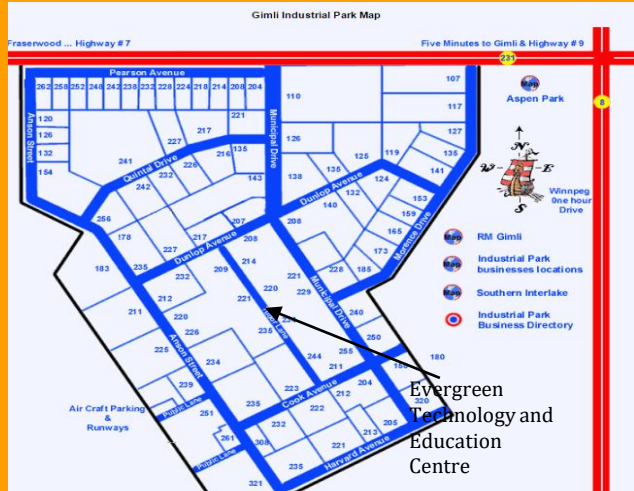


Can I earn credits if I am currently employed?

Mature Student High School Diploma

- Four grade 12 credits (40S)
 - Mathematics
 - English
 - 2 other credits
- Four grade 9-12 credits

How much will it cost?

- There is a \$40 annual registration fee. You can complete more than one course at no extra cost.

What happens if I don't finish a course by June?

- If you don't finish your courses by the end of June, you can re-register in September and pick up where you left off.
- The program has a continuous intake so students can work at their own pace.

What is the mature student high school diploma program?

The mature student high school diploma program is designed for mature students (19 years of age or older and out of school a minimum of six months) seeking a Manitoba Department of Education recognized high school diploma.

The program is flexible for the student's educational needs. Students can take up to eight high school credits over ten months to achieve their diploma.

A mature student diploma requires a grade 12 English, a grade 12 Mathematics, two other grade 12 courses and four additional courses from grade 9 to grade 12.

Students may already have completed previous courses in high school for credit toward the program.

Admission Requirements

- 19 years of age or older on or before September 30 in your year of registration.
